1. Aims

Through this policy we aim to:

- ⁽⁰⁾ Ensure that the Phoenix St. Peter Academy's uniform policy and practice are understood by all, so that we can share and adhere to our common values and aims.
- Insure that children comply with the uniform policy.
- ⁽⁰⁾ Ensure that parents and carers support this policy so that children are sent to school each day in the correct uniform, and they wear it correctly at all times.

Staff monitor and uphold our uniform policy.

2. Purpose

Our distinctive and smart Phoenix St. Peter Academy uniform is a visual representation of some of our key values. We have high aspirations and expectations for our children in their appearance, in the same way we do for their learning, work and behaviour. We treat all our children equally, and a strict adherence to uniform ensures no child can be seen as dis/advantaged in any way. All children are expected to wear the full uniform correctly at all times, including whilst making their way to and from school.

The school has ensured through a procurement process, that the main items of uniform (such as the school jumper) are available at very good prices from our supplier, Screens Schoolwear, and that parents /carers can also obtain items from any high street shop or chain, as long as they comply strictly with the descriptions below (Appendix 1). <u>A hardship fund can be accessed to support</u> families who need assistance, please speak to the School Office for support with this.

The school will ensure that uniform expectations are communicated through the sharing of this policy, and visual and written guidelines, supported with media communication (School Website, Facebook, Twitter etc.).

In accepting a place for a child(ren) at Phoenix St. Peter Academy parents/carers are agreeing to our uniform policy.

3. Implications for Children:

Our children are our ambassadors and the community may make judgements about Phoenix St. Peter Academy based on the appearance of our children. Children are therefore expected to wear our school uniform correctly at all times, including whilst making their way to and from school. Children must not wear incorrect uniform at any point during the school day, or change items of clothing during the course of the day – this includes before and after school.



4. Exceptions:

Exceptions to this are:

- P.E. days, when children are expected to come to school in their P.E. Kits (P.E. Kits should only be worn on P.E. days).
- 🥺 Medical conditions, which can be verified by the family G.P. / other medical practitioner.
- 🧐 Charitable 'non uniform' days.
- ⁶⁰ Some Educational Visits, where specific clothing is required.
- Inrichment days as directed by the school.

5. Expectations

Children are expected to take care of their uniform, equipment and kit, ensuring they look after it properly and do not lose items. <u>It is important that each home setting checks every item is</u> <u>labelled clearly with their child's name.</u>

Children must not only wear the correct uniform garments, but they must be worn correctly. In particular: shirts must be tucked in, and the correct colour socks are worn (plain black, grey or white). By September 2022 all children should ideally wear the Phoenix St. Peter Academy Sports Kit, or plain black alternative garments (no logos permitted) - not the current grey Hoodie. The current grey Hoodies will no longer be part of our school uniform from September 2022.

6. Non-compliance

If correct uniform is not worn:

- Any child who is seen to be wearing incorrect uniform will be asked to wear the correct uniform. If they have those items with them they will be asked to change into them.
- Ochildren who are wearing incorrect uniform garments, (including incorrect footwear) with regular and repeated disregard for the uniform rules will incur further consequences, i.e. time in The Link (Pastoral Support Room) during class time or during break times, or sent to Senior Leaders to explain the reasons for non-compliance, so that a resolution can be achieved.

7. Implications for Staff

All staff are responsible for upholding our uniform policy. It is important that any failure by a child to comply with uniform expectations is followed up by the Pastoral Team. Staff are expected to wear professional attire, suited to their role at all times.

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8. Implications for Parents/Carers

- It is important that parents and carers support the uniform policy to ensure children are sent to school each day in the correct uniform and that it is worn correctly.
- It is helpful for parents and carers to work with their children so they develop a sense of pride in their uniform and care for it at all times.
- It is the responsibility of the home setting to make sure that every item is labelled with the children name.
- In accepting a place for a pupil at Phoenix St. Peter Academy, parents/carers are agreeing to our uniform policy.

9. Implications for Governors

11. Uniform Guidance

- ⁶⁹ Shoes must not be canvas, or heeled. No industrial toe caps should be worn.
- ⁶⁹ Children must not wear suede, canvas, hug boots or above the ankle boots.
- In the winter months wellington boots can be worn for the journey to and from school, children can change into shoes in school. Wellington boots can be worn during open play; particularly for nursery and reception children.
- Skirt length should be on the knee and the skirt should be of a classic design e.g. 'A' line, box pleat or kilt. Skirts made of a stretch jersey material or very short skirts will not be permitted.
- Trousers should be tailored. Stretchy lycra or denim style fabrics will not be allowed. Children must not wear trousers with very tight fitting legs. Jeans, jeggings, jogging or tracksuits, pin-stripe and cords are not acceptable as an alternative to normal school trousers.
- Suitable alternative garments for P.E. Kit must be plain black, with no logos or hoodies. P.E. kit to be worn on P.E. days only.
- ⁶⁹ Belts may be worn but they must be plain grey or black with no large or obtrusive buckles.

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11. Birthdays:

9 Full school uniform must be worn; birthday badges may be worn for this special occasion.

12. Jewellery:

- ⁶⁹ Children may wear one pair of small studs, one in each ear lobe only.
- Or the second second
- ⁶⁹ Children are not allowed to wear fashion jewellery, necklaces and bracelets are not allowed.
- 9 Jewellery that does not comply with these guidelines will be confiscated by staff and put in a safe place to be collected from the office at the end of the school day by the child's family.

13. Health & Safety

9 Hair should be tied back for school; hair can be a learning distraction or a health and safety concern during social play and in particular during P.E. lessons.

14. Make-up and hair styles:

- Nail varnish must not be worn to school. The home setting will be contacted to come into school and remove the nail varnish, or grant consent for the child/member of staff to remove it.
- Make up should not be worn to school. The home setting will be contacted to come into school and remove the products, or grant consent for the child/member of staff to remove it.
- Premporary tattoos must not be worn to school. The home setting will be contacted to come into school and remove them, or grant consent for the child/member of staff to remove it.
- 9 Hairstyles should not be excessive i.e. line work/shaving and no bright, unnatural colours are allowed.
- 🧐 Small and subtle hair pieces may be worn such as grips, hair clips, bows, hair bands etc.
- No child will be allowed in class who in the Senior Leader's judgement has an inappropriate hairstyle or colour, including the perming of hair.

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15. Replacement of garments:

- Should a child refuse to wear the correct uniform, the will remain in the LINK (Pastoral Support Room) until they conform. Where appropriate the home setting will be contacted to enforce the school rules and expectations linked to school uniform.
- I Families are expected to provide suitable garments for the purpose of lessons or P.E. activities.
