They will also be looking forward to starting swimming lesson in Autumn Term, further information to follow.

Mr. Russell will be teaching P.E. and starting our Forest School provision.

Ms. Huxtable will be the school's full-time Academic Mentor next year. This is a significant additional role which will help us to increase our capacity for tutoring but also small group work.

Sarah Newman from Reset Counselling will continue to work with some children (with parental consent).

Improvements to our school facilities

During this academic year we have been able to refurbish the Pirate Ship and Trim Trail area; thank you to everyone who has supported our fund-raising efforts. We have also improved our Early Years outdoor provision, which has received positive praise from our Trust advisors and parents. Fencing in the car park and meadow has been replaced! After a lot of hard work by staff and children our Allotment area has returned to being a flourishing garden and it was praised this week by 'Lowestoft in Bloom'.

Next year we will be developing our Forest School provision, including the installation of fencing to ensure the children can enjoy this safely. We will be replacing the doors on the 3 'playground' classrooms during the summer, and there is a planned upgrade to classroom lighting.

Of course, our Year 6 classes will be leaving us this term, we are all very impressed with the progress they have made and the confident people they are growing into. They were a pleasure to be with in London recently and the City financiers who worked with them were extremely impressed with their behaviour and ideas. A school improvement advisor who works with our Trust by coincidence was on a train with our school and made a point of emailing me and saying the children were "delightful". They will be very much missed by our whole team, but we are proud of the fact they are ready for High School.
